#### **Congratulations to Year 11**

What a delight to do some analysis of the year 11 mock results to find a nearly 20% uplift in the English papers since October and a 6% uplift in Maths too on average. This places us in a strong position to ensure the best interventions are in place to ensure our students leave with Maths and English secured.

Year 11 have all been given a login for a new service called STEM tutoring. This is not free to college but is offered at a discount due to the deprivation levels we see in Scarborough. The programme is delivered in partnership with Harrow & Eton and is giving our students access to online tutoring in key subjects each evening after school. If students cannot make it to the live session then they can access the videos retrospectively. Please encourage your child to use this alongside revision guides, Sparx, GCSEPod and Seneca to keep their learning warm over the Christmas period.

#### **Well done Science Mavericks**

It was fantastic to see so many budding scientists head over to Knottingley this week to take part in the Science Mavericks competition against other Delta schools – we came a very respectable 5<sup>th</sup>; well done to Mr Chew and the students involved.

#### **Turing Scheme- Work experience abroad**

## SPARX MATHS HOMEWORK

Regular practice is essential for success in Mathematics. Our curriculum is carefully sequenced, and **Sparx Maths plays a vital role in helping pupils practise, retain, and build confidence with what they learn in lessons**. Sparx is carefully aligned to our Scheme of Work and supports long-term progress through regular, spaced practice.

To ensure all pupils benefit fully from Sparx, we are relaunching our homework approach with clear routines, strong support, and positive recognition.

### Sparx Homework Routine

- Sparx homework is set every Wednesday
- Homework is due the following Monday
- Tasks are an essential part of the Mathematics curriculum, not optional extra work

### Support Available in School

- Chromebooks are available during Open Biology on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday
- Sparx Club runs every Wednesday after school, providing support and a quiet working environment

### Recognition for Good Habits

- Pupils who complete Sparx on the day it is set (Wednesday) will receive a Young Professional Award, recognising strong organisation and independence

### Follow-Up for Incomplete Homework

- If Sparx is not completed by the Monday deadline, a detention sticker will be placed in the pupil's planner on Monday
- Pupils who then complete Sparx by Tuesday lunchtime will be free to leave after school
- Pupils who have not completed Sparx by Tuesday lunchtime will attend a 30-minute supervised after-school session on Tuesday, where they will complete the work

These routines ensure that all pupils complete the regular practice that underpins success in Maths lessons.

### How Parents Can Help

- Encourage pupils to complete Sparx earlier in the week
- Check planners for completion and any stickers
- Reinforce the importance of regular practice in Maths

Thank you for your continued support as we work together to build strong mathematical habits and confidence in all pupils.

## SAFEGUARDING

It is essential for safeguarding purposes that Lanyards and identity cards are worn at all times. Should cards become lost or damaged these must be replaced. Replacements can be purchased via MCAS. ## ATTENDANCE

It is very important to ensure that all medical and illness absences are reported daily by parents using our absence line or enquiries to Miss. Brown our Data and Attendance Officer. Should you make a call for a reported student illness – please expect a phone call back from the attendance team to check details and provide support as required.

Absences for medical reasons will only be authorised if evidence is provided, and it remains the responsibility of parents to provide this evidence. Acceptable evidence includes appointment letters or texts, and photographs of prescriptions or medications showing the name & date. These can be emailed to the enquiries email address or handed in/ shown at Reception.

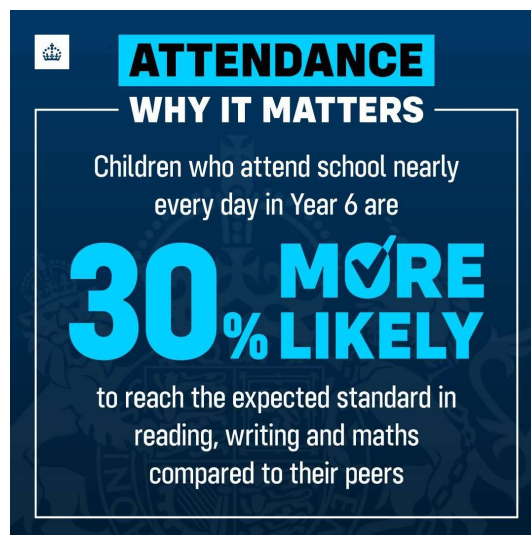
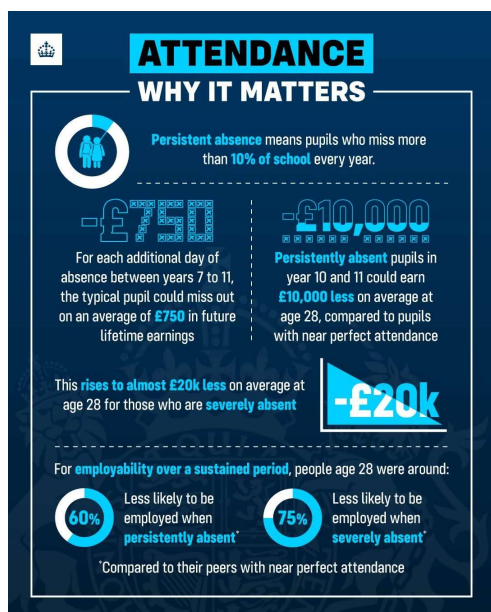
Attendance will always be a continual reminder. Excellent attendance is above 96.5%. It is important that all students work hard to continually improve, this contributes significantly to maintain and improve overall progress and attainment.

All students with 100% receive 10 professional points per week. Student above the 96.5 target receive 5 points per week.

Attendance monitoring and formal procedures are followed robustly. We work closely with NYC attendance team to address attendance concerns at the earliest stage.

## Attendance Focus

Student support to achieve excellent attendance is vital. In addition to support from our attendance team. Students will receive regular attendance support sessions in college and actions on home -visits will be scaled up.
